

FOR SENIORS: DON'T FORGET • TO APPLY FOR YOUR GUARANTEED INCOME SUPPLEMENT

If you are getting Old Age Security, you are probably getting a guaranteed income supplement. It comes included as part of the Old Age Security cheque.

In January, you should have also received a green form in the mail, separately from your cheque. This is called the GIS form. This green form guarantees that you will continue to get the income supplement. This form should be filled out and sent in to Canada Pension Plan by March 31, 1989.

If you notice that your Old Age Security cheque is about 50% less than usual, it means that you have not filled out and mailed in the green

form.

If this has happened to you, phone Canada Pension Plan at 666 3040 to get them to mail you the green form. If you already have the form, and need help filling it out, they will help you do it over the phone at 666 3040.

You can also go to 712
W. Hastings to fill the form in there. Ask the receptionist for the green form or the GIS form. If you think you might need help filling in the form at the office, you must phone first to make an appointment. Phone 666 6299.

SASKATCHEWAN POOR PEOPLE FIGHT BACK

Anti-poverty groups in Saskatchewan are getting together to form a coalition to fight against poverty. About 150 people from around Saskatchewan attended a poverty conference in Saskatoon on March 17th and 18th.

"I have the necessities—food, clothing and tax shelter."

One speaker at the conference gave a talk on rich "welfare bums". He found out that 170 of the richest people in Saskatchewan paid no taxes in 1984. He estimated that each of these rich people saved about \$5,236 a month because they claimed income tax deductions that poor people can't claim. Single "employable" people on welfare in Saskatchewan get only \$384 a month. In short, the richest people in the province more than ten times the amount of government handouts than people on welfare got.

Then take it to your local community centre and pick up your pass. You can renew this pass every six months.



If you made under \$15,000 in 1986 and did not file for your 1986 income tax, you can still get your \$50 return for 1986. The same is true for 1987 and 1988. There is a three year limit on getting money back from income tax.
