



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NEWS FROM THE ADVOCATES

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Happy New Year, Everyone! I hope you all managed to have a Christmas dinner or two, and that a gift made its way to your doorstep. Christmas and the New Year can be very difficult times, especially for those of us who have lost a loved one, or who are separated from our families. If you are feeling down, please try to reach out and connect with somebody. You may even inadvertently help that person out just when she needs to be around somebody, too. Remember, the Centre's Advocates and other staff will always try to spend some time with you if you need someone to talk to. **Disability I, Disability II**

Just when we finally got Social Services' new Special Needs and Disability forms figured out, the government went and changed them on us again. Yes, you read that right. The "new" Special Needs category has already been done away with, and replaced by a category called "Disability 1." The old "Disability" category is now classified as "Disability 2." I know that this becomes more confusing as time goes on. Don't fret if you don't understand it all, you're not alone. If you have been considering applying for Special Needs or Disability, please make sure you consult an advocate for information and help with your forms.

HIV Outreach Position

As you have probably heard by now, the Women's Centre received funding for an HIV/AIDS Outreach Worker, who will be working in tandem with a new HIV Outreach Worker from DAMS. These two staff will help women with, affected by, or at risk for HIV/AIDS (and that means almost all of us, in one way or another) get information about HIV/AIDS; make and get to Doctor's appointments; access



counseling and advocacy services; among other things.

Attending Meetings

You may have read the Steering Committee's notice in last month's calendar that women from the Centre are welcome and encouraged to attend out-of-Centre meetings with Staff. Last month Candance Smedley attended the Provincial AIDS Strategy, and the HIV Services for Women in the DE meetings with me (MH Advocate Christine Hutchinson). It was great to have extra representation for women from the Centre at these meetings, and important for other groups in this community to see women interested and actively participating in the decision-making processes that affect us so deeply. If you are at all interested in knowing about what goes on "behind the scenes" and speaking out about your community, ask an advocate about upcoming meetings, or find out from Candace what it was like for her to attend.

Meeting Notes Provincial AIDS Strategy

This meeting left me very disappointed. Perhaps I was expecting as broad and dramatic an action on the provincial level as has just occurred on the municipal level with the infusion of \$3,000,000.00 into the DE from the Vancouver/Richmond Health Board. However, nothing new was brought to the table. We may slow down the epidemic in the DE, but with a (no)Strategy like this, the rest of the province is in trouble.

HIV Services for Women in DE

Among the items discussed at this meeting was the possibility of opening a part-time-hours clinic for women and children in the DE. The clinic would provide women with a safe place to go for health information and care. Also discussed was the desperate need for more Detox and treatment facilities for women. Let's hope the government takes notice!

Notes from November

EVERY THURSDAY AT 1:30. Women come together to discuss the Centre and offer constructive

suggestions and comments Responses from staff and Steering are in italics.

Dec. 4th

The media event was great. The violence needs to stop, we would also like to see violence among women of the Centre stop. *Recommend workshops on violence. Effective communication skills. Possibly Deepa or Marion to facilitate.*

Shawn will be Centre liaison for children's issues with AWAN (Aboriginal Women's Action network) and other agencies. *Great, it would be better if another woman would get involved too.*

Sue would like to see women getting together to rent a house in a safe and cooperative fashion. Can the Centre provide a bulletin board for exchanging info.? Can Steering 'rent' the house and then re-rent to the women with cable, phone, insurance, etc. included so women don't get dinged for extra income from welfare. We should try the first item first and see how that works. We will ask steering for their opinion.



Shawn expressed concerns regarding the clothing room, there should be a 10 item per week limit not 10 items per day. Other women indicated that women often get clothes for family and friends who cannot come down to the Centre.

Concerns expressed that kitchen volunteers are not showing up and Julie is doing all the work by herself. Can Julie get more help, non-volunteer women would be happy to help, if allowed. Julie thanks everyone for their concern, kitchen volunteers need the food safe certificate. Please help by taking your dishes to the bin, cleaning up after yourselves and encouraging others to do so as well. Also attend the volunteer meetings, there will be a Food Safe course for women in February for anyone interested.

Maggie K. has been elected as the Women's Voice Rep. to the Steering Committee and Staff meetings. *This will be taken to the Volunteer meeting. What about a proper all Centre vote?*

Carol said that we should not be turning away used clothing in the weeks before Christmas. Women still need the clothing and sometimes this is all they have for gifts. Even take the donations and put them on the tables everyday as soon as it comes in. *It the past this has always been a problem, women end up fighting over the clothes and clothes are left all over the Centre. What do we do with the left overs. Our problem is we do not have enough space.*

Carol also would like to see a Social Action Committee started to deal with housing, welfare rights, lobbying, etc. The Centre used to have a Social Action Committee as part of the Steering Committee but it has been inactive. We also have had meeting scheduled for women who are interested in Social Action, started by staff but very few women were interested. Maybe it's time to try again.



Everyone expressed frustrations over Bridge Housing. It is taking too long and now it is up in the air again. we should just try to find a new space for the Centre with larger space and more facilities. Julie needs a better kitchen and staff needs offices, etc. Let's take over Woodwards. *It will be taken to Steering.* Stella would like everyone in the Centre to receive at least \$500 for Christmas -Preferably \$1,000. *We would like that too but we have no gun to rob a bank.* Dec. 11

Anne Bisson's memorial. It has been rescheduled for Dec. 30th. Her body has been brought back to the Yukon and her family will be back in town on the 20th. We will need food, a eulogy by the Centre women and a card for women to sign. We will be getting a guest book for women to sign and women are encouraged to bring in photos of Anne to be sent to her family.

Donations are looking good. We'll have a good Christmas. Anything for family and children that we do not use for Christmas should be distributed to Centre women and children.

Staff are doing a great job. The Centre is running good. *Thanks.*

Nancy with the bracelets has touching issues. She is always touching women. *Staff will make a point of talking to her daily.* Barb admits her behavior has been erratic and apologizes for this. She had many issues going on in her personal life. Her concerns for the Centre are genuine, she formally apologized to the Centre and to Christine Wood. Chris told her that she would withdraw the two complaints she had submitted regarding Barb, today.

Deepa made an announcement about her Christmas blues workshop.
