




UP-DATE FROM THE FINANCIAL MANAGERS:

REGULAR PROGRAMMING

Learning Group - Every Monday, doors close at 5:15. Exploring different ways of Learning.

Battered Women Support Services on Tuesday nights from 5 - 8:30, support for women affected by violence in their lives.

The Street Nurse will be in every Wed morning at 10:00 am to provide info on STD's, hepatitis and HIV/Aids and will do blood testing on site.

The Community Nurse - is in every Wednesday from 1:00. Watch out for health tips and information.

Alcohol and Drug Support Group - Wednesday from 5:00 - 8:00, do you have or had a drug and/or alcohol problem. This may be the place to get some support, no preaching or guilt trips.

Women's Voice - Thurs. 1:30. Let us know what you think about the Centre. Your opinions and ideas are needed.

Women Surviving Together - Thurs. 5:00 - 8:00 Healing Circle and support group for women.

Raffles - Usually on Fridays at 1:30 or 2:00. Items which are not clothing items that have been donated to the Centre are raffled. Please note changes this month.

Stopping the Violence Discussion - Every other Friday night. Gathering to share stories and strategies to keep ourselves safe. **Wenlido** begins again in May on Tuesdays at 5:00pm. Come and learn self-defense with Jennifer!

CRAFTY WORKSHOPS - Materials provided.

Beading with Leona - Every Monday, 1:30 pm. Learn how to bead, expand your skills or just share ideas..

Ceramic and Tile Painting - Every Thursday, 2:00. Make something that you can use everyday or give to a friend.

Fabric Arts with Freeda - Usually on Friday morning. Learn to do your own sewing and alterations and also to knit and crochet.

OUTINGS - Watch the Outing Board for RUSH tickets.

Wed. May 13 - Stanley Park Pitch & Putt

Wed. May 20- Trip to the village of Steveston located on the Fraser River near Richmond.

Tues. at 1:00 - An afternoon at the Children's Festival in Vanier Park with a picnic lunch.

SPECIAL

Thurs. May 21 - FOOD SAFE LEVEL 2 - All of you that completed your Level 1 can participate in this one day workshop.

Sign up sheets are put up at the beginning of the month, chances are there will be space available on the day of the outing.

NOTE: Sometimes things get canceled or set up on another day make sure to check "Update sheet" on the front chalk board. The Activities Board will also have information on other events.

Volunteer Meeting Minutes

April 12, 1998

1. Volunteer Laundry Days

Since the Centre is now open seven days a week, do the volunteers need another day for laundry? No one is having difficulty getting one load done, so no need to add days.

2. Adding Another Volunteer to do the Laundry Area

Volunteers had a big discussion about this topic. Different suggestions came up including having a volunteer that would do not just the laundry but also the bathrooms and the shower. The way it is now, the floor job is too big for one person. Women asked for clarification about the kitchen's role in the laundry and bathroom areas. There is confusion. Lucy and Cynthia will clarify at the next staff meeting. Cynthia is also worried that we do not always fill the schedule now. If we add another job, where will we get the volunteers?

Decision: Volunteers decided to add a fourth position to the schedule. This position will be responsible for the shower, laundry and bathroom areas (S,B,L).

Women voted on which positions will be filled first:

1. Front desk

2. Shower, Bathroom, Laundry
3. Floor
4. Clothing Room

Lucy and Cynthia will remind staff floorworkers that they must replace themselves if they go off the floor to deal with other issues.

The new position will be added to the schedule for May.

3. Crowding at the Raffle

There is a lot of crowding around on Fridays when the raffle volunteers are bringing items out of the cupboard and setting up the table. It is very frustrating. Women discussed the possibility of changing the time, the location in the centre, and not serving coffee and tea. Some volunteers did not know that coffee and tea were no longer served until the raffle was over.

Decision: Make an announcement at 1:00pm every Friday that coffee and tea is no longer being served. Also announce that until everyone is sitting down or standing back, the raffle will not begin. Lucy and Cynthia will remind the floor staff to help the raffle volunteer by making the announcements and getting everyone to clear the space.

4. Volunteers in the Kitchen

If kitchen volunteers have concerns, they must take them to kitchen staff.

5. Keys

There is a key to the front desk and it lives with the Volunteer Coordinator.

Where did the second key go to?

Staff have keys to the donation room and the clothing room.

6. Volunteer and Staff Pictures

Where are the volunteer pictures so they can be put up at the front?

Cynthia has them in her office.

Action: Denise and Mable will put the pictures together.

7. Food Donations

Donated bread that was stored in the chest freezer has gone missing. A lock will be put on it.

8. Clothing Donations

Volunteers need help from the floor staff when clothing donations come in. Sometimes when women are asked to help bring things in, they leave with some of the bags.

Conclusion: Both staff and volunteer floorworkers need to help when the front desk volunteer calls them re: clothing donations. Also, don't ask

women to help again if they leave with the stuff.

9. Complaints

What is happening about them?

Women are encouraged to write up complaints but then they wait and wait for an answer. Complaints go to the steering committee..

Conclusion: There should be a report back to women directly from steering.

10. Food on Stat Holidays

There was no food on Good Friday, not even coffee or tea. Why can't there be relief staff for the kitchen?

Action: Cynthia will check in to see if there can be food and coffee and tea for next time.

11. Volunteer Appreciation Week

What about doing something for volunteer appreciation week? Lucy is concerned that it is coming up next week. We could definitely plan something for next year. Also we could plan our own volunteer day or week in May or June. Someone suggested a picnic would be fun. Several women volunteered to have an idea session about the women's centre volunteer appreciation event.

Decisions: Lucy will make a sign to acknowledge volunteer appreciation week and we will put it up with Denise and Mable's presentation of the volunteer pictures.

Sheila, Denise, Megan, Helen, Vera, Claudia and Lucy will have an idea session about the May/June event. Lucy will post a sign on the volunteer's bulletin board with the time.

12. Cleaning the Centre

The centre needs cleaning!! Louise, Bunsy, Mable, Candace, Gwen, Vera, Megan, Peggy and Wendy are volunteering to come in on an evening to do it. It will involve cleaning the walls, dusting, wiping down the chairs, maybe even painting.

Decision: Come up with a date that does not conflict with other events.

13. Spring Dinner

Cynthia went over the details about the Spring Dinner. She will post a list of volunteers and their duties.



Attention All Smokers

As you know, new smoking bylaws are being put into effect all over the city. The Worker's Compensation Board has done an assessment of the Centre and instructed us to implement the city's health policies. Effective immediately, smoking in the Centre will be allowed only in the "couch" area by the front door. All sit-down tables and Staff offices are now "NO SMOKING" areas. Ultimately, this should help to cut down on staff and volunteer staff illnesses.

Beginning on the 15th of July, the entire Centre will be a NO SMOKING environment. We hope that it will be warm enough outside that we will all be able to adjust to this in comfort. Please extend your respect to everyone who uses the Centre by observing this new rule, and thank you all for helping us to make this change a smooth one.
