BC TEL has a program for low-income women at high risk of abuse who need a phone. Since the announcement of the cellular phone initiative in November, 1997, the ministry of Attourney General has received many calls from women requesting a free cel phone.

A woman in need of access to a telephone due to her safety being at risk, and:
- has no existing credit
- does not have an outstanding closed account - agrees to full toll restriction and no long-distance calling

## Volunteer Meeting - September 13, 1998

#### 1. What's new?

We discussed the change over that will soon happen when Lucy leaves and Cynthia returns. Everyone assumes this is what's happening but she is responding to personnel this week.

Several volunteers are going to camp and we will need to cover those shifts. Also a reminder that the AGM is coming up. Who's running for the board?

#### 2. Signing up for shifts

There has been a question about how many planned shifts everyone can have. The agreement is two shifts but what about bingo and the kitchen? After much discussion it was decided that the kitchen should be separate but that bingo volunteers should count their Wednesday shift as one of their two pre-planned sign ups.

3. Volunteering in the kitchen
When someone works both in the
kitchen and then on the floor or
clothing room, please get two
signatures on your volunteer hours
slip. That way the kitchen can sign for
their hours and the volunteer
coordinator of floor staff can sign for
the other. One slip, two signatures and
say how many hours in each place so
we can keep the statistics straight.
If you work two shifts in the same day,
you get two bus tickets for each shift
(four tickets altogether).

Also, we need more volunteers to sign up for kitchen shifts. Right now, Mary is doing a lot of work and she doesn't want to volunteer every day.

3. Volunteering on the weekends
There have been times on the
weekend where there are not enough
bus tickets. Lucy will look into why
this is happening because she leaves
enough tickets for all the shifts.
Sometimes it is confusing on the

weekends for volunteers because one staff says this and another tells you something different. Lucy will ask Dawn and Carol to decide who is supervising volunteers and giving out bus tickets on Sundays and let everyone know. Whichever one of them is working Saturdays (they alternate) will be in charge then.

At no time are some volunteers supposed to be bossing around other volunteers or telling them they have to do shifts. This has been happening and it is not okay. It is making volunteers angry or not wanting to come in to the Centre when they are not working. Everyone agrees that we should respect each other.

#### 4. Breaks


Volunteers need breaks and we all agreed to take two 10-minute breaks per shift.

Lucy wants to meet with the bingo volunteers and go over the new regulations. When everyone is together, we will make a time.

we can deal with frustrating situations
while on shift. It will be held next door
on Monday, Sept. 21 at 2:00pm.

The DEWC cannot provide bus tickets for every woman who needs one. We do provide tickets for volunteers who have worked a shift, for evening groups and for steering who live out of area. The floorworker will not be giving out bus tickets. If you have a medical emergency, one of the advocates will contact your financial aid worker and it is up to the Ministry to provide your transportation.
