WHO IS JULIA

Julia was born and raised in Vancouver, BC. After her marriage in the mid 1980's she moved to the Sunshine Coast with the hope to connect with her roots. After her separation in the early 1990's she returned to Vancouver.

Julia has always been drawn towards the Downtown Eastside (DES) just as other women in her family have been before her. Julia has meet women at centres in the DES who were friends of her natural mother have told her how much she resembles her mother and thought they were having flashbacks.

There have been numerous women in Julia's family who not only lived but have died in the DES. Her mother died of abuse, in the late 60's or early 70's; her grandmother died of stomach cancer, in the late 70's, and choose to die in a hotel room without any assistance from doctors, friends or family; her 3rd cousin died of a very brutal death in the early 90's. And, today she has two 3rd cousins that both live in the DES and who are suffering from abuse. So my heart goes out to those who have someone in their lives who are at risk.

Julia strongly believes that women suffering from abuse whether it is self, substance, physical or emotional abuse need support that will guide them to wanting a positive change. This belief has been demonstrated by her support through donations made in the past to the D.E.S. Women's Centre, through volunteering her time at various DES centres since 1994 and through working for various non profit organizations.

Julia has a very unique educational and work history and has been given the name of "CrossWorlds" meaning that she is capable of communicating at various levels between the Native and non-native.


