CUTS TO HEALTH CARE IN BC

- ➤ 2001 election campaign
- Liberals promised they would not cut health or education spending

IN REALITY:

- > 28,000 health care jobs will be cut in the next year (as revealed in a secret budget document released to the media March 4th)
- > 85% of those jobs are held by women
- the three year funding freeze imposed by the government on health care will result in (because of inflation, aging pop, pop growth)
 - > \$1.5 billion in service cuts to front-line health care
 - > This translates into:
 - hospital closures, emergency room closures, growing waiting lists, reduced community health services i.e. Patient's Rights workshop,
 - <u>AND</u> off-loading costs on to users...
- MSP premiums will increase by 50% May 1st (Alberta & BC)

> MSP no longer covers

- Physiotherapy
- Chiro
- massage therapy
- naturopath
- podiatry
- We must now pay 100% of the cost of these services
- Those on MSP premium assistance are now allowed only 10 visits in total per year for all these health services
- Everyone between 19 and 64 must now pay for 100% of the cost of eye examinations
- Pharmacare Our provincial drug plan is under attack
- > 17 drugs have been cut from Pharmacare
- Pharmacare deductibles have increased by \$200 for everyone
- By January 2003, eligibility for Pharmacare benefits will be income-based – about 420,000 seniors will pay even more for their drugs

- On budget day the provincial government increased the provincial sales tax by .05% to raise money to pay for the increase in doctors' fees
- The VWHC will lose 100% of its provincial government funding in 2004. That gives us 2 years to figure out how to meet the needs of the thousands of women who visit our health information resource centre each year looking for important health info!
- The government claims it's putting PATIENTS first!
 If the government was putting patients first it would be getting drug costs under control, putting doctors on salary, and putting social programs ahead of tax cuts!!!
