## **REGULATORY BODIES**

Health care providers have their own organizations that decide standards for health care, policy and licensing. These organizations are called regulatory bodies. Their purpose is to protect the public but also to guide and supervise their members, who are the health care providers. Most of these organizations have a similar structure. They have a group of elected or appointed members called a Council, an elected Executive Council (President, Vice President and Treasurer), and different committees such as the Inquiry Committee and the Finance Committee. They serve the public by setting standards for quality of care, by giving referrals and information, by handling complaints and finding solutions for those complaints, and by disciplining their members when needed. If you have questions, concerns, or need referrals, don't hesitate to call these organizations.
