

Coalition Responds to AZT Challenge

I'm sure that by now few of us are unaware of the outrage to PWA's and ARC's, involved in the Vancouver clinical study of AZT, who opened their mail two weeks ago to be faced with whopping big bills for their drug retroactive to last July, 1987! The 300 of us on AZT had never been told there would be a price tag on the drug when we entered the controled study and volunteered to be guinea pigs. We had been assured that the Fed's and the provinces, across Canada, had struck a deal where the provinces would pay for the total cost of the drug under existing Pharmacare systems. Foolish us not to get it in writing! Well our province has reneged on the deal and has become the only province to charge us for AZT. Our share, under the Pharmacare plan, will be \$2,000.00 per year, a price tag that few of us can afford. It seems typical of this Social Credit government that they insist on treating AIDS as a moral issue not a medical one. Our Premier, Bill Vander Zalm, with his Catholic, right wing views seems to impose his values on the governments response to AIDS in B.C. The equation is made that AIDS = Gay = sin = punishment. So I suppose that it is no wonder that Victoria tries to extract its pound of flesh from people with AIDS.

Now, to add insult to injury, Peter Dueck, Minister of Health in B.C., announced that the government would pick up the total cost of the expensive drug, Cyclosporin, used by transplant patients but would leave AZT users out in the cold. This can only be seen as a clear case of discrimination!

The Coalition reacted swiftly to this challenge on the right to survival for B.C. PWA's. At a well attended Board meeting, we planned strategy and launched an intensive media campaign to create awareness of this government action. Many PWA's at the meeting, and those that called the office were concerned not only in regards to how to pay for the drug, but also by the apparent breach of

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confidentiality created by the release of our names to the billing department. All of those on the study had been assured at the outset of confidentiality, and now there is some concern as to what might Victoria do with those names.

Currently, we are building a network of allies to fight Victoria. So far, we have the support of the B.C. Civil Liberties Assoc., the B.C. Ombudsman, Dr. John Blatherwick, Micheal Harcourt and the NDP Caucus, the Canadian AIDS Society, AIDS Vancouver, and hopefully, the Federal Center for AIDS.

COALITION PREPARES FOR CANADIAN CONFERENCE ON AIDS

Toronto is gearing up for the big Canadian Conference on AIDS, to be held May 15 - 18, and so are we at the Vancouver Persons with AIDS Coalition. We will be sending 3 - 4 delegates to represent Western Canada's PWA's, and our own Kevin Brown has been asked to chair one of the main plenary sessions, entitled " AIDS: the Reality ".

This conference is an excellent opportunity to network with other AIDS organizations and PWA's across Canada, as well as engage in some high level lobbying of representatives from the Federal Centre for AIDS. One of our main focuses will be the fight for greater access to experimental drugs, and the desperate need for increased research and funding in Canada. We also will fight for the rights of PWA's to play a greater role in the battle against AIDS. We CAN be part of the solution - not the problem!

COALITION RECEIVES INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION

Warren Jensen, one of the founding members of the Coaltion, has been asked by a representative of the planning committee for the Fourth International Conference on AIDS, to be Chairperson for one of the major sessions on "AIDS and Human Rights". Warren's particular panel will discuss "Ignorance: a Tool of Discrimination".

It is exciting that Canadian PWA's will have a voice at this most significant conference, and our congratulations goes out to Warren!

INHALATIONAL PENTAMIDINE STUDY TO START: by Kevin Brown

Many Vancouver PWA's may soon be able to enter a controlled study to test the effects of Inhalational Pentamidine as a prophylaxis for Pneumocystic Carinii Pneumonia.

This is the promising treatment that the Coalition has heard about and lobbying in favor of for close to a year now. It also is a treatment that is becoming widely accepted in the U.S. to halt the reoccurance of P.C.P. (New York's PWA's swear by it)

The Vancouver study will be conducted by Dr. Lindsay Lawson, a valued member of the AIDS Care Team, and a doctor held in high esteem by the PWA Coalition.

There has been some controversy over this study, and a similiar one in Toronto, because of the use of a placebo, and the strict entrance criteria. I think PWA's and researchers will always argue over the ethics of placebos - we can only seem to agree to disagree. To be quite frank, it is better to have some research in Vancouver than no research at all!

I trust Dr. Lawson's integrity, and she has proven her committment to PWA's in this city. The Coalition applauds her as one of the few doctors willing to get involved in research.

The Coalition will still continue to fight for wider access to this new treatment, (we have a few aces up our sleeves) but in the mean time, if you qualify, you might check out Dr. Lawson's study.

As a volunteer for AIDS Vancouver, and a member of the PWA Coalition, I recently attended the Buddy Core Training presented by AIDS Vancouver. The purpose of this training was to familiarize new and old volunteers with the needs of the organization. It was open to concerned people interested in being phone volunteers, buddies, office support...basically whatever Roy can find that needs doing. AIDS Vancouver and the Coalition play very important roles, and volunteers are a large part of both organizations.

I was asked to write this article because I came away so positive about myself, and my association with both groups. There are the benefits of personal growth and awareness from attending seminars and group activities (such as Tuesday nights Support Meetings at St. Paul's) by just being around people that care. Answering the hotline at Aids Vancouver four hours a week gave me an insight to the basic workings,, but being around 56 people (at the Core Training) giving of themselves, learning of our needs, was a revealing event. The patience and understanding of the facilitators led us to explore the far reaching aspects of AIDS...a new experience for many. Micheal Welsh effectively put us through the total experience of diagnosis, and the progression of AIDS, in this case to it's conclusion, death; a very emotional experience. I made some important decisions on how to make my life more complete.

I am looking forward to taking the entire Buddy training in June (open to PWA members for self interest), and to being more involved in the needs of our community.
