All Nations Hope AIDS Network is a group of Aboriginal people who are concerned with HIV/AIDS & Hepatitis C (HCV) in Saskatchewan.

The number of cases of HIV/AIDS among Aboriginal people has continued to increase steadily over the years. Statistically, there is one new case of infection every day among the Aboriginal population.

Several groups have proven to be at risk for infection. These groups are:

- ◆ Intravenous Drug Users
- ◆ Women
- ◆ Two-Spirited People
- ◆ Youth
- ◆ Inmates

Aboriginal people of Saskatchewan have to look at taking a leadership role in HIV/AIDS education, prevention, and support services.

HARM REDUCTION INITIATIVES

These services are targeted to groups at risk for becoming infected with HIV/AIDS & HCV

Harm reduction is simple, it means reducing harm to an individual at risk till they are ready to change their behavior and deal with their issues. Meaning, when they are on their healing journey, they don't have to deal with being infected with these life threatening viruses.

All Nations Hope supports the following services available to the Aboriginal people.

- ◆ HIV/AIDS & HCV Education Workshops
- ◆ Needle Exchange Programs
- ◆ Condom distribution
- ◆ Methadone Maintenance Programs
- ◆ Alcohol and Drug Treatments Programs
