AVI is in the process of recruiting a fulltime Education Coordinator. This is a staff position.



As the national voice of Canada's health care facilities, one of CHA's primary goals is the provision of timely information to the health field.

This video is an in-service educational resource which features the emotional response of health care givers to the concerns, attitudes and challenges relating to some of the "technical" and psycho-social aspects of caring for persons with HIV-related disease. A teaching guide accompanies this video.

If you'd like to borrow this new acquisition or any of our other video tapes, audio tapes, books or research material from our library files (over our two week limit), drop into our office and browse through, view or listen to the many tapes and material available.
