Fish oil diet could slow cancer, help on AIDS

ST. JOHN'S Nfld.- Fish oil diets may slow the progress of cancer and could help AIDS patients and victims of other diseases, American researchers say.

"I think it's going to be important for people to become aware of good nutrition for children as well as adults," said Laura Jenski, associate professor of biology at Indiana University-Purdue University in Indianapolis. "The major impact is going to be for the younger people."

A new study by a research team at the university's school of science suggests that fish oil reduces the growth of leukemia tumors in young mice.

She presented the findings at an international conference on nutrition and immunology in St. John's this week.

Earlier this week, a study by researchers from the University of Texas at San Antonio showed that fish oil may also reduce the side effects of chemotherapy and AZT, a highly toxic drug taken by AIDS patients. (*Times Colonist July 19,1991*)



Free To Travel To United States? Not Yet...

The U.S. Government, which was scheduled to lift its ban on travel and immigration into the U.S. by persons with HIV on June 1, 1991, has extended the ban for 60 days as a result of opposition from within the administration, from Congress and from Conservative segments of the public. U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services, Dr. Louis Sullivan, says he will use the 60 days to gather additional comments from both sides of the dispute before making a final decision.

THE U.S. government has already received 40,000 letters opposing the lifting of the ban. Apparently, many members of Congress were active in organizing the letter writing campaign.

U.S. AIDS activist groups and their allies are attempting to organize a telephone and letter writing campaign calling for removal of the ban. Your immediate help is needed! We need your letters and faxes to go to the Department of Health and Human Services and the President!

Meanwhile, officials at Harvard University have reiterated that the 1992 VIIth International Conference on AIDS, scheduled for Boston, will be cancelled unless the ban is lifted. Allen Fein, Executive Director of the Harvard AIDS Institute said, "the imposition of travel restrictions on people with HIV is a discredited and discrimation policy, and its reintroduction is a tragedy for the fight against AIDS and for human rights in general."
