A COMMUNITY COMMITTMENT

December 1 is World AIDS Day, as designated by the World Health Organization in Geneva, Switzerland. The theme for World AIDS Day 1992 is "A Community Commitment". In support of World AIDS Day, AIDS Vancouver Island has asked all Vancouver Island mayors to proclaim World AIDS Day in their communities.

"We have traditionally asked only the City of Victoria to proclaim the day," observed Dale Weston, Executive Director of the Vancouver Island AIDS Society. "This year, however, the theme, "A Community Commitment" gave us an opportunity to more effectively promote our mandate, and we have asked that all Vancouver Island community mayors make the same proclamation."Weston noted that to date thirteen Island communities have endorsed the proclamation, with many MLA's and all Vancouver Island MP's lending their support. "The timing of this renewed commitment and support from all parts of Vancouver Island is especially significant in light of the AIDS-profile brought about by Dr. Peter's hard work across British Columbia."Highlights of the proclamation include the recognition that the AIDS virus crosses all social, political and economic boundaries, and that one of the main goals of AIDS Vancouver Island is to confront Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome, prevent its spread through education and support all those affected by the disease and advocate on their behalf. In keeping with the theme, members of the entertainment and arts community will stage "A Celebration of Life" at the McPherson Theatre on December 1 at 8:00 p.m.

Under the direction of STAGES DANCE THEATRE SOCIETY, and with the support of the McPherson Foundation, Monday Magazine, and CHEK TV this gala evening will present a variety of artists and entertainers including, Doc and The Doo Wops, Lynda Raino, Lebeau Peterson Band, STAGES DANCE COMPANY, Kim Breiland and many others. Tickets for the evening are \$16.50 and are available at all usual Box Office outlets.

LGBA OFFERS WENLIDO COURSE

With recent increases in homophobic assault all over North America and the insistence on the part of the gay community that such violence is unacceptable, gay men everywhere are arming themselves with the skills needed to stave off or prevent being bashed. To this end, the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Alliance of Victoria (LBGA) will be offering a short two-day course in WENLIDO to ensure that gay men in the Victoria area have the skill and confidence to help prevent them from becoming yet another gay bashing victim.

WENLIDO, a unique hybrid of several martial arts, was developed in the 1970's by women who wanted to teach how to fight back effectively in the case of maleperpetrated sexual assault. To date, thousands of women all over North America have learnt these skills, and empowered themselves in a situation where they were otherwise powerless.

This LGBA-sponsored course is a first in that it will be geared specifically to gay men, with course material that has been developed specifically by the instructor for gay men. The course will be offered on two consecutive Saturdays on January 10 and 17 from 10:30 to 5:30 at the University of Victoria. The fees are very reasonable at \$50 for non-UVIC students and \$30 for UVic students (with proof) or PLW/HIV's. The class will be limited in size to twenty students, so it is best to register as soon as possible for what will prove to be a popular class. To register, phone Brian Young at 384-2562.

VOLUNTEER NEWS

AVI COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

The following committees represent the five main areas of responsibility of the Board of Directors, Committees and sub-committees are chaired by Directors who recruit members from the AVI volunteer community, as well as from outside the Society.

Education Committee coordinates all public awareness programs and special events, including:

a. Candlelight vigil

b. AIDS Awareness Week

c. World AIDS Day

Finance Committee manages the overall control and direction of all financial records of the Society; assists administrative staff in maintaining accurate financial records, reports and financial statements; and assists in budget, audit and grant proposal preparation.

Programs and Services Committee recommends and reviews client based and community outreach programs and support services. These include:

a. Emergency Assistance Fund - administering the EAF policy/guidelines.

b. Interagency Relations - liaising with community professionals and service organizations.

c. Island outreach - maintaining communication with other AIDS service organizations and providing support and referrals to clients outside Victoria.

d. The Living Room - liaising with PWA representatives concerning client needs.

Resource Development Committee ensures personnel and fiscal resources are available to the Society. Subcommittees established to do this work include:

a. Donor Services - establishing and maintaining a base of donated goods/services to support daily and special functions at AVI.

b. Fundraising - establishing and maintaining a strong financial base and conducting fundraising activities.

c. Membership Services - increasing membership, and ensuring appropriate recognition is provided to all members.

d. Nominations - recruiting volunteers to serve on the Board, as vacancies occur, and prior to the Annual General Meeting.

e. Public Relations - promoting programs and services, and increasing public awareness of the Society.

f. Volunteer Development-assisting Volunteer Committee and Volunteer Coordinator with recruitment, recognition and other related matters.

I accept and absorb all the mystery of the heavens for I am a part of the vast unknown


I believe God to be all these elements and the force that unites them



AIDS: You Can't Catch It Holding Hands

One of the few AIDS books for young children in our AVI collection, this is a charming "letter from Niki" that parents and their kids can read together to open up discussion (suggested age group 5-10). The illustrations are colourful and childlike, the text humorous but practical.

Although this book is more about preventative behaviours, the emotional impact of learning a cherished friend or relative has AIDS is addressed by lines like "the worst part is the anxiety it causes in those who are sick and to those who love them". Very frank reading material. (contains 52 pages, Lapis Press, 1987).

WITNESS: Dr. Peter

Host: Knowlton Nash Producer: David Paperny First airing date: November 2, 1992

This is the second video of Dr. Peter in our library. Dr. Peter was the host/physician of AIDS Diary on CBC News. This program is more extensive than our half-hour long <u>Man Alive:</u> Peter's Story, going back to the very start of the diary appearances (July 27, 1990) to the present (Nov. 2, 1992). It is a personal, intimate portrait that serves to give a name, face and identity to AIDS. There's a good balance of light and serious moments here with topics that cover the spectrum of subjects from Karposi Sarcoma to spirituality. This video makes an excellent PWA profile for classroom or home viewing.

- WHEREAS the government of British Columbia recognizes that the AIDS virus crosses all social, political and economic boundaries, and
