

SUPPORT SERVICES

Greetings from Roshni, Bart and Alicia who are all so busy keeping the Support Services Department flowing smoothly that they've no time to write a column. Check the calendar for a list of some of the upcoming Support Services related functions.

STREET OUTREACH SERVICES

Is the needle exchange just that? I was able to catch up to Claire Dineen, Street Outreach Coordinator, to do an interview with her. We began with the mandate then carried on with other duties of S.O.S.

The mandate of the S.O.S. is to prevent HIV/AIDS and related infectious diseases. The prevention is done through needle exchange and condom distribution to street involved individuals, primarily for injection drug users and sex trade workers.

S.O.S. consists of two full time workers, seven casuals and twelve volunteers. Also, S.O.S. has two nurses provided by and employed by the CRD Health Unit. All employees of S.O.S. are those who; can work and deal with a diverse clientele, have an understanding of HIV/AIDS and understand poverty and addiction issues. Volunteers undergo a two night training orientation then they are integrated (as volunteers) into S.O.S. Volunteer responsibilities include direct contact with clients, street outreach, assisting staff with food donation pick-up, as well as running errands to and from the AVI main office. This opportunity allows volunteers (who are involved in other sectors of AVI) to utilize those skills learned at S.O.S.

S.O.S. clients range between 12 years old to 60 plus. They may be any one or more of the following: steroid users, longtime drug injection users, sex trade workers, street youth, or those with psychiatric diagnosis. S.O.S. offers: anonymous HIV testing, Hepatitis tests/shots, pregnancy tests, sexually transmitted disease treatment, counselling/referrals, needle exchange and lots of ears and hot java.

S.O.S. also provides educational and street based workshops and services. For instance, Claire, a volunteer, and another staff member will go out into the community to do workshops to promote education and safety issues. S.O.S. has given presentations to: Vancouver Island Regional Correctional Centre (monthly), William Head Penitentiary, Pemberton Detox, Sandy Merriman House (Emergency shelter for women), and other Social Service agencies.

From April 1995 to March 1996 S.O.S. exchanged 128,000 syringes, had 16,000 drop-ins and distributed 59,600 condoms. Victoria has one of the lowest rates of HIV caused by drug use in North America.

S.O.S. also provides mobile needle exchange in Duncan, serving the area from Shawnigan Lake to Chemainus. This service exchanges up to 11,000 needles per year. Condom distribution is also done in the Duncan area.

I asked Claire if there was one thing she would like those who are not familiar with S.O.S. to know, what it would be? She replied, "It is imperative that people are aware of the necessity of S.O.S. and realize their impact is necessary in prevention strategies for HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted diseases."

It is plain to see that the needle exchange is not just that! Congratulations to Claire, the S.O.S. staff and volunteers for doing such a miraculous contribution to our community. Next month I'll take a closer look at S.O.S. with its staff members.

News from the Island... Support Services for PWAs in Nanaimo and across the Island have been very busy. The volunteer Support and Care Team training has recently been completed in Nanaimo, and we welcome our new support volunteers. Thanks to Roshni, Alicia and Bart from Support Services for the training (and great food!).

On Sunday, June 23rd, the 4th Annual AIDS Benefit will be held at the Queen's Hotel in Nanaimo to raise funds for the Financial Assistance Fund. The benefit will include live bands, raffles and an auction. Please come and support this event if you're in the area... The Nanaimo HIV/AIDS Education Project brought YouthCO to Vancouver Island in April, providing intensive peer training sessions for youth in the communities of Nanaimo, Port Alberni and Parksville. The in-depth training sessions were well attended, and participants commented that the workshops were very informative and inspiring. The next few months of this project, co-sponsored by AVI and the Central Vancouver Island Health Unit, will be focused on education to community agencies in the Nanaimo area and preparing for the Quilt display. The Canadian Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt display for Nanaimo is still in the works. However, we have postponed it until '97. We want to build a stronger base of support for the project in Nanaimo before we go ahead. The display will be held in the late spring or early fall '97 and will include more than 60 sections of the AIDS Quilt - each section 12'x12'. We need volunteer support now if this is going to be a success! We need people with organizational skills, individuals with experience in promotion, bookkeeping, working with volunteers, quilters, as well as many general tasks and assistance at the time of the display. We will also be working with people in communities across the Island to make the quilts in their community to bring to the display in Nanaimo. This is a BIG project and will require lots of volunteer support!!! EDUCATION UPDATES

We are currently working on a database which will encompass books, videos and journals. My aim is to have the database up and running with most of our materials entered by the end of the summer. The new system will allow consumers to search materials by author, subject or title. This should make things much easier for people writing research papers, preparing for Speakers Bureau, or searching for information for personal use.

The system will also allow us to track how often resources are used so that we can buy new materials accordingly. I have noticed that there are quite a few books missing from our present library so if you have any AVI materials at home please return them so that we can catalogue them into our new system. During this change over, things are going to be a bit disorganized so I would like to thank you all, in advance, for your patience.

The Helpline and Speakers Bureau are also in the process of change right now. The Helpline is currently in transition to its new location across the hall. The new space is brighter and more open than the old one and, after all the dust settles, it should be very comfortable to work in.

Meanwhile, I have been taking advantage of the slow season to brainstorm some ideas for adding new skills to the Speakers Bureau. I have taken into account some of the feedback from the volunteer focus group as well as the community and am trying to develop a plan for sharing techniques and skills in our monthly meetings. So, Speakers, keep your eyes and ears open for the next meeting coming up in June!!


