Police temporarily end squat. Five people jailed. Halifax Squat Update #3 (27 October) Adam S. <hapi@ziplip.com>

At approximately 1:00 pm this afternoon police ended the occupation of the abandoned infirmary on Queen St. in Halifax that was being squated in an effort to bring attention to the lack of affordable housing and rent control in the city. The building was held by about a dozen courageous men and women for just under 24 hours before police seized the building, arresting five people. Other anti-poverty activists vow to continue their just campaign for affordable housing, new squats will be opened soon. Jail solidarity actions are taking place in front of the police station on Gottigen St., people are encouraged to come and show your support.

As long as people are on the streets, if they don't give us shelter, we'll take it!

there are appx. 12-14 people now have entered and are still (8:45pm) inside the old abandoned hospital on Queen Street.

## Halifax Squat Update #2 (27 October) Jon Elmer, HFX 347am

People barricaded in the old Halifax Infirmary are refusing to leave despite police orders to have the squatters removed from the long-abandoned building. Even now, more than fourteen hours later, many more are huddled under jerryrigged tarps outside in a futile attempt to stay out of the driving wind and torrential rain, providing support for the group inside demanding that the city convert the building (or one like it) immediately to social housing.

Coinciding with similar "give it or guard it!" actions against the shameful state of public and social housing across Canada - including Vancouver, Sudbury, Guelph, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal - the Halifax squat is a clear message that people are no longer willing to freeze to death on the street while the slow-grind of federal and provincial bureaucrats who promise little and deliver even less.

The police have warned that they will be evicting those inside, almost all of whom would otherwise be curled up cold and wet in the doorway of a store.

More information when its available, but until then resources and support are welcomed and encouraged at the Halifax Infirmary on Queen St south of Spring Garden.
