Playin' Safe Project

The Playin' Safe Project is a national study of gay men with
consistent safer sex practices based in Ottawa. Participation
involves an on-line written interview via the Playin' Safe web
site, or a 45-minute telephone interview with the study coordi-
nator.

Eligible participants must be "out" gay men over 25 years of
age who consistently practice safer sex (i.e. if you have anal
sex, using condoms is your usual practice).

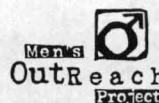

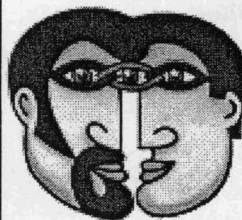
