## "Finally got the news"

This film tells the story of black revolutionaries organizing in the auto factories and communities of Detroit in the 1970's. Hellish working conditions, police brutality, and systematic racism, provoked one of the longest and most costly riots in US history - the 1967 Great Rebellion. In the years following, the Leage of Revolutionary Black Workers created a radical union movement in the plants of Chrysler, Ford, and GM. Less known than the Black Panthers, but no less important, the League presented militant and effective challenge to the power structure of Detroit, combining community organizing with shop-floor mobilization. In the words of one League organizer -

Finally got the news
How your dues are being used.
Be bad, be bad, be bad, be bad!
Can't do nothing if you ain't bad!

The film is about an hour long, and will be followed snacks and beverages. All Yerevani, an APC organizer, will host a discussion afterwords.
